


STEM Ambassadors


Finding Volunteering Opportunities

The STEM Ambassadors platform is great for finding different volunteering opportunities that suit you. Educators or youth group leaders will post requests for a STEM Ambassador that you can register your interest in supporting.




Once you are logged in to the STEM Ambassador platform, go to the menu bar on the left-hand side and click 'Find activities'


From here, you can browse the activities in your local area and filter them by type, age group, interests, and more. You can also look for exclusively online or in-person opportunities.




Click on an activity to view more details:




If you think the opportunity looks right for you, click express interest and send the organiser a message to introduce yourself:



You can then discuss further details and confirm your availability using the integrated messaging system. The teacher can then accept or decline your offer of support.





This activity will then show under upcoming activities in your activity log. If you click into the activity, you'll be able to see your messages with the activity organiser.
